

## Perkins Career and Technical Education

The President's budget proposes **\$949,500,000** for Perkins CTE, a **14%** cut to the program from current funding levels. Below is an estimate of how much Perkins CTE funding each state will lose under the President's proposal.<sup>1</sup>
