

## WIOA Title I Youth Activities

The President’s budget proposes **\$523,667,000** for WIOA Title I Youth, a **40%** cut to the program from current funding levels. Below is an estimate of how much WIOA Title I Youth funding each state will lose under the President’s proposal.<sup>1</sup>

E.g. for the youth program, these factors include the share of unemployed in areas of substantial unemployment, the share of excess unemployed, and the share of economically disadvantaged youth. <sup>2</sup> For purposes of comparison to the PY2016 allotments, the calculations made to estimate state grants assume a 0.28% evaluation set aside that was used in PY2016 and therefore do not add up to the President's proposed total.
