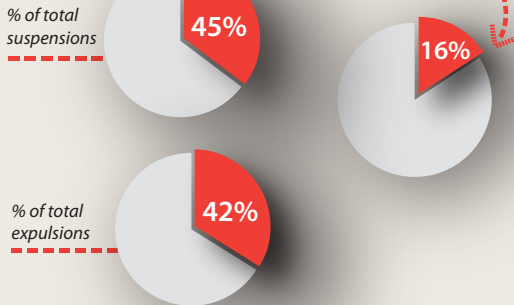
Young Women of Color



SCHOOL DISCIPLINE (K-12)

1 in 10 Black female students is suspended during the year
 [a rate 5 times that of their White peers]

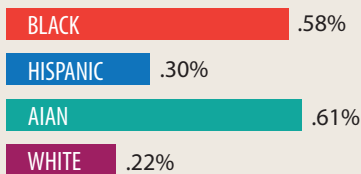
Black female students are disciplined at rates **2.75x** their proportion of the student population



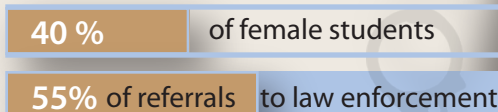
American Indian/Alaskan Native (AIAN) female students also experience high rates of discipline

1 in 20 suspended

Female students of color are more likely to be referred to law enforcement from school

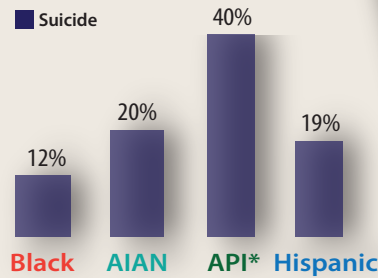


Black and Hispanic students compose

Percentages of deaths due to suicides among women of color

Death rates per 100,000 for young people ages 18-24: Black (25); AIAN (70); API (11); Hispanic (19).

22% of sexual assaults **28%** of assaults

recorded by hospitals

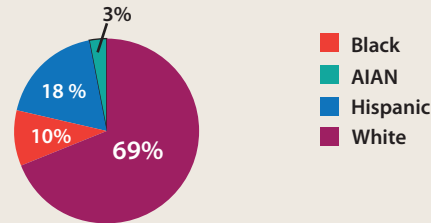

Black young women are **20%** more likely to be **stopped in public** by the police than White young women

Arrests of all young women 18-24

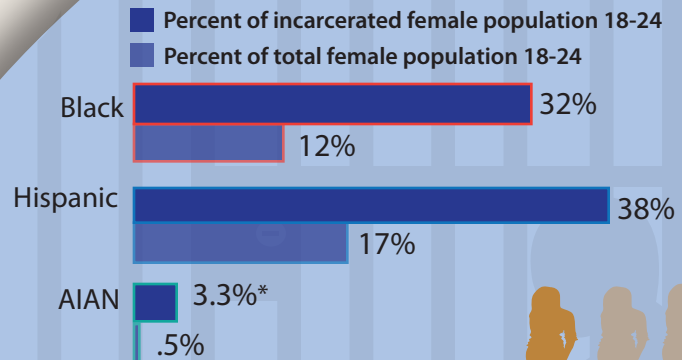

INCARCERATION

(does not include jails)

Young women of color are incarcerated at disproportionately high rates



Most incarcerated young women of color do not have a high school diploma

52% of Black young women
66% of Hispanic young women

Many incarcerated young women of color were unemployed before arrest

44% of Black young women
45% of Hispanic young women



1 in 4 incarcerated women of color reports a history of sexual assault*†

* Estimates should be interpreted with caution due to small sample size.

† This is likely an underestimate.
