

For further explanation of these categories, see *Notes on CLASP Calculations*. Analysis of state fiscal year expenditures may differ from this analysis.

²State TANF MOE spent on child care included in the sum of total child care spending excludes funds that may have been counted towards CCDBG MOE.

³This is the total amount transferred to CCDBG in 2004 or 2005, regardless of whether it was liquidated in that year. TANF transfers that were liquidated in 2004 or 2005 are included above as CCDBG discretionary spending.


