

Arizona Child Care Spending, FY 2001-2008 (in millions of dollars)



*According to the Arizona Department of Economic Security, overall child care spending increased by \$19.3 million (12%) between FY 2004 and FY 2005. Spending shown here, as reported to HHS, does not include unmatched Arizona State General Funds. In FY 2005, Arizona increased its use of State General Funds due to a lack of available CCDBG funding to meet an increased caseload. In FY 2005, non-CCDBG funds comprised nearly 30% of Arizona's child care spending, compared to over 1% in FY 2004.


