YOUTH CURRENT EVENTS

FY17

- Generally level-funded opportunity youth programs (and other child and youth programs)
- One big loss: the Social Innovation Fund was defunded.

FY18

- President's budget released
- Proposing devastating cuts to social programs (nondefense, discretionary)
- Hoping for a year-long CR

FY19

 Likely the most critical year, in which large consolidations/block grants/cuts will be on the table.
